Subject to available financial aid, first term tuition and fees for new students become due at the point of entry. Thereafter, tuition and fees for each succeeding term is due at the start of each academic term. Failure to make proper payment unless otherwise cleared with the business office will result in dismissal from the University.

Additional fees may be charged for testing or certification required for certain programs.

† The Approx. Total Cost of the program is based on tuition charge per quarter, (average 11 weeks per quarter with a few exceptions), multiplied by the total number of quarters, graduation fee, digital textbook and program fees described in the other footnotes. Actual total costs may be different depending on the total number of credit hours attempted and quarters attended.

Due to certain state requirements, the program curriculum may vary. Please contact an admissions representative prior to enrollment for program details.

A digital textbook will be provided for applicable courses and will be automatically secured through South University's contracted third-party vendor. The student cost for digital textbooks will be charged to the student account in addition to tuition. For term programs, the student cost is per quarter at \$20.00, \$40.00 or \$80.00 based on enrollment level; for non-term programs, the student cost is \$20.00 per course; and for the Doctorate of Ministry program, the student cost is \$400.00 per quarter for the first six (6) quarters for a customized South University Logos package. The customized South University Logos package is not refundable. For students opting out of the digital textbook, the associated charge will be reversed on the student account after the Drop/Add Period. Not all courses include a Digital Textbook. Courses that include a Digital Textbook will be noted in the registration material. Students who do not opt out will not need to purchase print textbooks for courses using a Digital Textbook. The purchase of the Digital Textbook is not refundable. Students who do opt out will be responsible for purchasing the required textbook. If a course does not use a Digital Textbook, the student is responsible for purchasing the required textbook.

The Associate of Science in Physical Therapist Assistant program includes a \$55 Test of Essential Academic Skills V (TEAS V) testing fee in the Program Fees.

Students in the Associate of Science or Associate of Applied Science in Physical Therapist Assistant who are required to take ENG0099 and/or MAT099 will be required to take UVC1000. Students required to take UVC1000 will complete 114 credit hours of work for their degree.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing program includes a \$55 Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) testing fee in the Program Fee. Excluded from the Approx. Total Cost is a non-refundable \$500 acceptance fee. It does not apply to the RN to BSN degree program. The acceptance fee will be applied to the student's first quarter tuition payment. If an applicant accepted into the BSN program encounters circumstances that prevent their matriculation, any amount paid by the applicant that is above the nonrefundable acceptance fee will be refunded.

The Doctor of Pharmacy program has a \$50 application fee charged by PharmCas included in the Program Fees and a \$1,000 non-refundable acceptance fee excluded from the Approx. Total Cost. The acceptance fee will be applied to the student's first quarter tuition payment. If an applicant accepted into the Pharmacy program encounters circumstances that prevent their matriculation, any amount paid by the applicant that is above the nonrefundable application fee and acceptance fee will be refunded.

Students applying to the RN to BSN program, who have earned an Associate's degree in nursing from an acceptable accredited institution, may receive up to 90 transfer of credits for the General Education and Foundation course requirements.

The Associate of Science in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program includes a \$16 entrance examination fee and a \$55 Test of Essential Academic Skills V (TEAS V) testing fee in the Program fees.

The Master of Arts in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program has a 10-quarter track and an 8-quarter track. Program length and total cost will vary based on the track selected.

The Doctor of Pharmacy program has a \$50 application fee charged by PharmCas included in the Program Fees and a \$1,000 non-refundable acceptance fee excluded from the Approx. Total Cost. The acceptance fee will be applied to the student's first quarter tuition payment. If an applicant accepted into the Pharmacy program encounters circumstances that prevent their matriculation, any amount paid by the applicant that is above the nonrefundable application fee and acceptance fee will be refunded.

Students in the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Management may choose to take an Anatomy and Physiology course, only BIO1011 and BIO1013 satisfy the Natural Sciences requirement. Students enrolling in either course must, however, also take the related co-requisite lab courses: BIO1012 and BIO1014 respectively. Students electing this option for their Natural Sciences requirement will complete up to 184 credit hours of work for their degree, depending on their exact choice.

Students in the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology may choose to take an Anatomy and Physiology course, only BIO1011 and BIO1013 satisfy the Natural Sciences requirement. Students enrolling in either course must, however, also take the related co-requisite lab courses: BIO1012 and BIO1014 respectively. Students electing this option for their Natural Sciences requirement will complete up to 184 credit hours of work for their degree, depending on their exact choice.

Students in the PharmD/MBA program may complete the majority of the MBA credits as part of the Doctorate of Pharmacy program. The remaining credits needed to earn the Master of Business Administration will require approximately 2 quarters of coursework.
